Reflection—Sower, Soil and Seed




We hear the Good News of this kingdom, but we ask ourselves what sort of soil we are. Do we enable the message to take root and grow? Do we produce a harvest of good works, signs pointing

towards the kingdom and helping to bring it about? We also ask ourselves what sort of seed we are? Do we die to ourselves that Jesus may live in us? For Jesus says elsewhere that a seed has to die to itself to be transformed into a plant.

We could also ask ourselves: what sort of sower are we? Do we attend to the word of God, reading, studying, praying and knowing the scripture so well that we can be confident in relaying the good news to others? Or do we rely on the 'professionals' to do the work of sowing the word? It is not enough to know ourselves, we need to be able to explain and express that faith to others who may be hungry for it. How can we expect a harvest if we keep the seed to ourselves?

The kingdom will come about; but what are we doing to help make it so?

We are open this weekend, Saturday morning a team of cleaners, thoroughly prepared and cleaned church. Even though open, Mass will continue to be live streamed on my Facebook page - Paul Roy Lomas.

Church will be open before Mass for private prayer but not after Mass, as church will need to be cleaned.

We can return to having Exposition and Benediction on a Friday morning from 10.30 to 11.45 am.

Mass will be in church at 10 am each day.

All this will happen but we must maintain the social distancing required, wear a mask or face covering. Use the hand sanitizer provided in the porch. Avoid touching surfaces as much as possible. After each mass the church will be cleaned again.
