RE-OPENING OF OUR LADY OF THE SACRED HEART FOR MASS - INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARISHIONERS

We are pleased to announce that Our Lady of the Sacred Heart will re-open its doors for Mass from this Saturday 4th July 2020. During the weeks ahead, Mass will take place at the following times:

Saturdays 4.00pm

Sundays 9.30am and 10.30am

Tues-Fri 9.30am

As you will no doubt expect, we have gone to great lengths to help to ensure the safety of yourselves and other parishioners, and as a result, created a number of measures listed below that we require all parishioners to follow when coming to church to celebrate Mass.

- Please only enter through the main church doors. The side chapel door is not to be used.

- Please do not touch any door handles whilst moving through the building, all doors will be propped open.

- Please do not touch any statues in and around the church.

- When you arrive outside church, please queue using the markers on the floor, this queuing system will maintain social distance.

- You will be greeted at the entrance by a trained volunteer (steward) who will direct you into church when it is your turn.

- A steward will ask you to sanitise your hands and read all of the signs in the foyer.

- The steward will direct you to another steward who will direct you to your seat/s, filling up from the front of the church. Please follow the stewards and their instructions as to where you can sit.

- There will be one person per pew – seated at different ends – please see the signs on the seats

- No standing will be allowed.

- Household groups/bubbles will be permitted to share a pew at the front of the church. Where possible we ask that members of the same household/bubble attend the same Mass in order to maximise the number of people in church.

- When in church, please maintain silence where possible.

- It is very important that parishioners do not move around the church once the steward has shown you to your seats. Please remain seated and do not use the kneelers.

- Please follow the signage and do not touch any statues, door handles etc.

- If children attend Mass, please ensure that they stay seated with you and follow the 'No Touching' rules in place.

- When Mass begins, singing is not permitted although prayer responses are. Hand-shaking is also not permitted during the sign of peace.

- All parishioners must stay seated to receive Holy Communion. The Priest or Sister will move around the church to give Holy Communion. Please receive the host with outstretched arm and on your hand only.

- A collection will take place, we ask that you place your donation on the collection plate when exiting the church. Alternatively, we welcome donations via standing order.

- The stewards will dismiss you at the end of Mass. Please remain silent until you have fully exited church.

- In order to exit church, you will be directed to walk through the main church doors starting from the back pews.

- There will be no lighting of candles permitted.

- There will be no toilet facilities available.

- Please respect the stewards; they are volunteering their time to help the church community and to keep you safe. The church has a reduced capacity due to social distancing regulations. We recommend that you arrive from 15 minutes before Mass to enable the stewards sufficient time to implement health and safety measures. Places in church will be allocated on a first-come-first-served-basis.

- Please maintain a minimum safe distance of 2 metres from others at all times.

- It is not compulsory to wear face coverings for the safety of yourselves and other parishioners as we are still operating the 2m distance rule, but if you wish to wear one, please feel free to do so.

- If you are not working, please come to a weekday Mass to leave space for those who are working to attend Mass at the weekend.

- If you are feeling unwell or have any other symptoms, please stay at home and rest, following government guidelines.

- Please call the Parish office on 024 7631 2293 if you develop symptoms of Covid-19 after attending Mass and follow government guidelines.

- Please remember, at present the Sunday Obligation has been lifted and any Mass will fulfil your obligation.

- As there are only a limited number of places available, Masses will continue to be live streamed. Anyone attending Mass does so at their own risk.

NB: There will be a MAXIMUM of 30 people per Mass.

NUNEATON FOODBANK Harvest time in Nuneaton has traditionally seen very significant donations from places of worship and schools for which we have been very grateful, and we have had a large number of volunteers helping in the warehouse over the Harvest period. This cannot happen in the current situation. We are being advised to 'quarantine' donations for a few days that have not come in directly from supermarkets, as these items will have been handled a number of times. Unfortunately we do not have sufficient space to do this, and so we are asking that you do not make the traditional Harvest Donations this year. We would like to suggest how you might help us with an 'Alternative Approach to Harvest' this year, by making financial donations to enable us to buy the specific items we run short of, in the differing amounts that we will need over the autumn season. Although we are very well stocked with many items, we continue to need very specific items of food and toiletries, and these items change quite regularly. We have been helped a great deal by donors responding to these 'specific requests' on our 'Shopping Lists' in our updates. We have measures in place as directed by the government to ensure the safety of all. The children have responded incredibly well to the measures, adapting quickly. As a school we have learnt to embrace new technologies. Our assemblies and collective worships have taken place virtually using ZOOM. The cameras in church ensure the children can take part in Mass, and Fr Michael has become an expert in recording video messages! Teachers have worked hard to ensure we have a recovery curriculum in place which gives the correct importance to the wellbeing of our children as they learn. Thank you to the stewards for their hard work and dedication that make the opening of Church possible. There is now a Rota for October in the porch on which you can sign up for a slot. FROM MONDAY 14TH SEPTEMBER The Government introduces the restriction of NO MORE THAN SIX PEOPLE TO MEET OUTSIDE IN A GROUP OR INSIDE FOR PRIVATE GATHERINGS. The restriction of people in places of worship is unchanged. We can have 30 individuals at a 2 metre distance in church, now all wearing face coverings as the norm if you don't have a medical condition. If there are a family group or people from the same household we can accommodate more depending on each individual circumstance. Governmental Guidelines are changing all the time so we have to be vigilant and of course abide by the latest restriction and law. I thank you for your co-operation in these challenging times. We will look at Baptisms later on. Also First Holy Communions and Confirmations but these will take a little time while to co-ordinate with the limited numbers etc. Please be patient!
