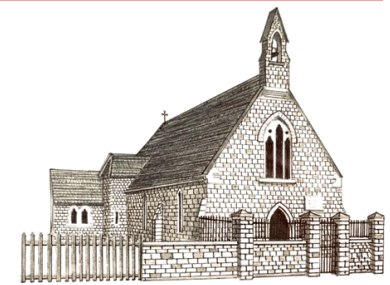

Covid 19 – The Pandemic and the Closed Churches We hear all kinds of news in the social media. Recently I have received guidance from the diocese on what we need to do when the churches are to be open. It looks like we would have to have a deep clean before we can open the doors. Then social distancing will have to be in place. Arrangements for people to exit and enter and so on. I know Cardinal Nichols has talked about being open for private prayer, but many of our churches are closed most days normally. **As I have read the Risk Assessment document from the Archdiocese I am not convinced that with only one entrance/exit we can maintain social distancing. So the church will not be opening for private prayer.** I think it will be some weeks before the church will be open for us to gather together to celebrate Mass. See the other news about praying together in the church front garden. Stay safe, stay home, keep praying.

As we can't open church safely for private prayer, I'm suggesting the following.

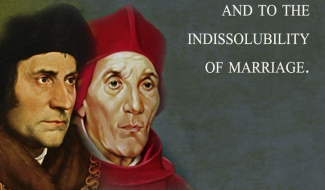
Those who wish to could meet in the garden with me on the two benches allowing social distancing. This would be on the Friday morning from 10.30 to 11.30 if weather is dry. A **telephone call to arrange you're coming** will eliminate too many people arriving at once!

Also I thought we could arrange to say the Rosary together in the garden. Perhaps at 11.30 am on the Friday after the meeting time with me. Being outside is safer than inside. We can sanitize the benches/ chairs and keep gate open to minimise danger. Maintaining social distancing is possible in this situation.

On Sunday morning I had my first social distancing visitor on the benches, a visitor who brought the pencil drawing of the Church which is now on the front of the news sheet this week.

We wanted to let you know about a new service set up by the Association of Christian Counsellors (ACC) in response to the evident distress and suffering of many people as a result of the situation caused by COVID-19.

ACC's COVID-19 Crisis Counselling Support Service is for anyone in the UK, whatever their faith, who has been bereaved during the time of the epidemic and anyone working within an NHS setting in a frontline role.

The service offers anyone who is eligible up-to ten sessions of counselling on a no-fee basis from a professionally trained counsellor. All the volunteer counsellors belong to ACC or an equivalent professional body for example: BACP, UKCP and NCS.
